Uniforms

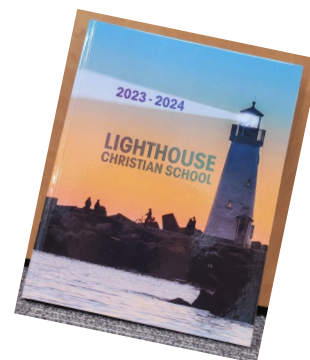
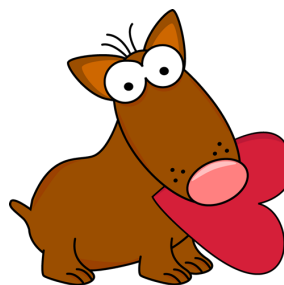
