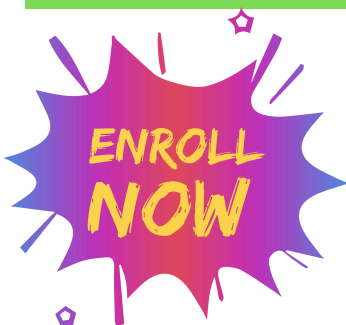
FEBRUARY/MARCH SPECIAL EVENTS

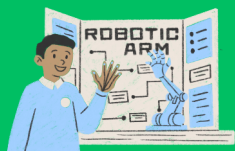
